In July 1971, the Church as it is today, was dedicated by Bishop Stephen McGill who asked the people to 'treasure your church and make it a joy to the Lord.' These words provide the cornerstone to all the activities and opportunities which flourish within St. Joseph's Parish.

Our Parish is blessed with three wonderful Catholic schools, two primaries, St Joseph's and Our Lady of the Missions, and our Secondary High School, St Ninian's. The Parish and the schools work together in teaching our young people the true values of our Catholic faith, and recognizing the importance of parents as the first educators of their child in the ways of faith.

One of my predecessors, Bishop Brian McGee, the bishop of Argyll & the Isles, served here as Parish Priest in the late 90's, offering himself with great love for the people and the life of this Parish. He instilled this faith in Action. May we continue to express that faith in our homes, schools and Parish.

I very much hope that you will feel at home in the Parish and come to love it as much as I do. If I can be of help to you in any way, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Weddings

The Church rejoices with you as you prepare to enter the Sacrament of Marriage and wants to support you as you start your journey of married life. It is important to contact Father Stephen ideally twelve months, but at least six months before your intended wedding date. This allows time to arrange documentation and obtain any necessary permission to marry.

Marriage Preparation

As part of preparation for marriage, you are invited to attend a day for engaged couples designed to encourage you, enrich your relationship and enhance your understanding of the Catholic Church's teaching on marriage and family life. The day runs from 10.30am – 3.30pm at the Diocesan Centre in Paisley. Further details can be obtained from the Diocesan Office in Paisley by either emailing marriageandfamily@rcdop.org.uk or phoning **0141 847 6130**.

Baptisms

The Church rejoices and welcomes your child into the family of God through the sacrament of Baptism. Baptisms take place on a Sunday at 1pm by prior arrangement with Father Stephen. Parents wishing to have their baby or child baptised should first complete a Baptismal request form. This can be downloaded from the Parish website <http://stjosephclarkston.com/> or obtained from the sacristy or Parish house. On completion, this should be e-mailed to stjosephclarkston@rcdop.org.uk or handed into the Parish House, and Father Stephen will make contact with you.

Baptism Preparation

Prior to the Baptismal Service you will be invited to a short pre- Baptismal preparation meeting to discuss the significance of the Sacrament. For more information please contact Linda Henderson on **07747 038909**.

Hospital

If you have a planned admission to hospital for a serious procedure, it is recommended that you receive the Sacrament of the Sick before going to hospital. Please speak to Father Stephen about this.

When you are in hospital and wish a visit from a priest or hospital chaplaincy team you must request this. Due to Data Protection Regulations this can only be done by calling the hospital chaplaincy team or asking the ward staff to contact them on your behalf. Gift Aid

Since the Parish is a part of the Religious Charity of the Diocese of Paisley (SC013514), taxpayers can make a Gift Aid Declaration for their offerings to St Joseph's. Tax that has already been paid on your donations can then be reclaimed by the Parish. If you pay tax above the basic rate, you can claim back the difference between the rate you pay and basic rate on your donation.

Over the course of a year Gift Aid brings around £29,250 into our Parish funds. This helps with repayment of the Parish debt, which has arisen as a result of recent renovations to the Church. 


Scouts





PARISH AND DIOCESAN COLLECTIONS



Building Fund (1st Sunday of every month)

Due to extensive building work carried out over previous years, the parish incurred a significant debt to the Diocese of Paisley. The yearly interest payments for the loan are approximately £12,000. In 2019 the parish made payments totalling £70,370 towards the debt. As a result, as of February 2020, the St Joseph's Parish debt to the Diocese of Paisley stands at £317,844.

Additional essential remedial work within the grounds is also required. We are now focusing on reducing this debt which, with everyone's support, we hope to achieve in a timely manner.

Our target is to raise a minimum of £50,000 per year, through our monthly Building Fund collection, the 200 Club and additional fundraising activities. We hope that everyone in the Parish will support these appeals so we can significantly reduce the Parish debt.



Justice & Peace (January)

This collection helps fund our Scottish Catholic Justice and Peace Commission, our Marriage Tribunal and our Catholic Parliamentary Office. Our Justice & Peace Commission campaigns against renewal of Trident, for fairness for asylum seekers and refugees and for action against climate change and for the environment. It also networks with parishes and advises our Bishops on social justice, international peace and human rights.



Pro-Life (January)

The goal of the Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) is a Scotland that protects life from conception to natural death. SPUC works to protect human lives at the national and local level, and to build a society free from abortion. We also campaign against other direct threats to the lives of vulnerable individuals, such as euthanasia and embryo abuse.



SPRED (February)

Our Paisley Diocese SPRED offers people with learning disabilities spiritual nurture in a small community of faith and a sense of belonging to a parish community. The collection supports groups to meet across the Diocese allowing parishioners to come together in faith and friendship to share and experience God's love.



Sick & Retired Clergy (March, April, Sept)

We remember our Sick & Retired Priests of the Diocese with great love and affection. We have fourteen retired priests still active in prayer and witness: one living in Rome, six in houses throughout the Diocese, four in parish presbyteries, and three at the Residence of the Little Sisters along with Bishop John Cunningham. We thank God for the gift of these priests and keep them in our prayers.



SCIAF (75%) & St Mirin's Fund (25%) (March)

The proceeds of this collection are divided, with 75% going directly to SCIAF and 25% contributing to our new St Mirin's Fund.

SCIAF is the official aid and international development charity of the Catholic Church in Scotland. Inspired by the gospel, SCIAF tackle the causes of poverty and injustice. We reach out with love to those in need, regardless of age, race or religion. We believe in supporting the whole person, including their spiritual wellbeing, political voice, cultural and community life.

SCIAF works in sixteen countries across Asia, Africa and Latin America helping the poorest in the world, regardless of religion, to work their way out of poverty. For further information visit www.sciaf.org.uk or phone Peter McMillan **07791 651525**.

The St. Mirin's Fund awards small grants for good causes that promote the Kingdom of God among us, with special consideration given to: children and young people, the elderly, those with disabilities and special needs, refugees and those suffering from poverty, mental illness or homelessness.



Holy Places (April)

This collection is for the upkeep and repair of the fifty shrines that are dear to Christians and pilgrims the world over; and for the Church's pastoral, educational, social and cultural mission in the Holy Land. These include the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, the Church of Mary and Joseph's homes in Nazareth, Peter's house in Capernaum, the Upper Room of the Last Supper and of Pentecost and the Church of the Calvary and the Holy Sepulchre.



Vocations and Ecclesiastical Students (May)

This collection pays for our Paisley seminarians studying in Rome. Currently we have four students whose seminary fees are £20,000 per year. This collection also goes to the upkeep of our Scots College in Rome that welcomes many visitors from Scotland as a place of hospitality for Scots in Rome.

During Vocations Awareness Week, "Priests for Scotland" invite young people in our schools or parish youth groups to reflect on how they see themselves as God's "work of art"; on what it takes to be the kind of person God wants them to be, and how, for some, that might mean thinking about a vocation to priesthood or religious life of some kind.



Day for Life (May)

Day for Life is the day in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. It highlights the Catholic Church's response to issues in our society including human trafficking, domestic abuse and accepting death. The proceeds of the Day for Life collection assist the work of various themes relating to the sanctity of life, with a different theme each year. Their website www.dayforlife.org has resources and information covering the journey of life.



Communications (June)

This collection pays for our national Scottish Catholic Media Office which provides a service to the press and media with information on the activities of the Church in Scotland.

On Communications Day we are asked to pray and support the work of the catholic media who work to protect, promote and proclaim our Catholic Values in an ever changing and challenging world.



Peter's Pence (June)

This is the practice of the laity to provide financial support to the Holy See to allow the Holy Father the means to respond to those suffering as a result of war, oppression, natural disaster, and disease. It is an ancient practice which began with the first community of the apostles. It continues to be repeated because charity distinguishes the disciples of Jesus: *"From this, they will all know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another"* (Jn. 13, 35).



Apostleship of the Sea (July)

This provides practical and pastoral care to seafarers, regardless of nationality, belief or race through port chaplains and volunteer ship visitors. Ninety per cent of world trade is transported by ship but the life of a modern seafarer is dangerous and lonely. They may spend up to a year at a time away from home, separated from their families and working in harsh conditions. The chaplains and volunteers welcome seafarers and offer welfare services, advice, practical help, care and friendship. Founded in Scotland, the Apostleship is now part of an international network known as Stella Maris that works in 250 ports around the world.



Mission Sunday (October)

Missio Scotland is the Scottish branch of the Catholic Church's mission aid agency. This enables missionaries to help communities in need through grassroots projects. They build and maintain hospitals, schools and seminaries, care for people in need and act for justice in the developing world, regardless of race, stigma, religion or gender. World Mission Sunday is the one Sunday in the year when the Mass is celebrated exclusively for missionary activity.



Scottish Catholic Education Service (October)

This collection supports the Scottish Catholic Education Service (SCES) which promotes and protects our Catholic schools in issues of national significance, and supports our schools, parishes and dioceses. The mission of the Catholic school is to develop as a community of faith and learning, providing the highest quality of education, and offering formation through the promotion of Gospel values, through celebration and worship, and through service to the common good.



Mary's Meals

Mary's Meals provides one good meal to some of the world's poorest children every school day. Our work is named after Mary, the mother of Jesus, who brought up her own child in poverty.
